

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


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## PRODUCTION BIOS

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

WE AT THE SPRINGER WISH TO ACKNOWLEDGE WITH GREAT RESPECT THAT THE LAND UPON WHICH WE ARE FORTUNATE TO MAKE ART IS THE ANCESTRAL HOME OF THE MUSCOGEE (CREEK) PEOPLE, WHO DOMINATED THE SOUTHEASTERN PART OF THIS CONTINENT FOR THOUSANDS OF YEARS.

AS MUSCOGEE LAND IN NORTH GEORGIA AND ALABAMA WAS GRADUALLY SEIZED AND SETTLED, THE PEOPLE FROM THE UPPER MUSCOGEE CHIEFDOM OF COOSA JOINED THEIR COUSINS IN THE LOWER MUSCOGEE CHIEFDOM OF COWETA BEFORE MOST WERE FINALLY REMOVED TO OKLAHOMA BY THE U.S. ARMY IN 1836-37.

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
