FROM THE DIRECTOR BETH REEVES



L's Saturday morning. As mom wakes me up, we have breakfast and drive to go get our hair done. Listening to Anita Baker, Jill Scott, and Luther Vandross in the car, we drive past fields of cows eating early in the morning with farmers on their tractors. As we pull on the gravel driveway, we see a sign that says "Genelle's". I'm greeted by a rooster in the yard as opposed to a bell ringing as I walk in. Genelle was my beautician for over 10 years. Her salon was located right next to her house and was built by her husband, Gene.

To us, it was a place to come and look beautiful for church, the date that I had that night, or my senior pictures that were coming up within the next week. I

could tell, as Genelle did my hair, that this place to her was a mansion-fit for queens. To her, it was a sanctuary, therapy session, a runway show to model our styles and outfits, to read the latest article in Ebony and Jet magazines, or to start a conversation on mental health within the community. This salon was a beacon of light for the women in the neighborhood. To let our afros out, to have braids re-braided and for our souls to be fed through laughter. But also to be fed through our stomachs. Gene was the best cook in town-grilling bar-b-que right outside the door.

Therefore, when asked to direct this script, I felt it was a calling to pay tribute to those times in Genelle's salon (mansion). I see/hear my mother, my sister, women in the church, friends, and even myself. It also goes back to times where Black women would get their hair done in the kitchen. As you walked into the house, you could smell that hot comb on the stove. I also recall going to Ms. Lonnie's house and getting my hair done in her kitchen as a little girl.

This story touches on self identity, sisterhood, life, death, beauty, and above all laughter. As a director, my vision for this production was to pay tribute to Oshun of the Yoruba people of Africa, the goddess of love and light. Oshun is often associated with the color yellow. If one looks closely, you will find yellow wallpaper on the set and a yellow light as the radio DJ speaks. I also want to pay homage to entrepreneur, political and social activist Madam CJ Walker who was a native of Louisiana (where this script takes place). She was the first female self-made millionaire. Lastly, Tamara Curry-Gill was a teacher, director and actor whose name I thought was so important to have in the rehearsal hall and on this stage. She is forever missed and this show is also dedicated to her spirit of love and beauty. As Truvy and Annelle make their hair butter named "Madam Tamara", Tamara reminds me in my spirit everyday to be a beacon of light.

I am so proud of this cast. We laughed, cried, vented, made discoveries and connected on so many levels in the rehearsal hall. I guess you could say it was like a salon-except no one came to get their hair done. I dedicate this performance to Genelle and Gene who have been gone now for 10 years. Thank you for being that beacon of light for me, my mom, my sister and the women in the community for years. You taught me "Laughter through tears is my favorite emotion."

PRODUCTION BIOS

Beth Reeves is a professional teaching artist/actor/director who is a graduate of Columbus State University, where she received her M.Ed. in Theatre Education. She has worked with Dalton Little Theatre, The Creative Arts Guild, The Springer Opera House, Fountain City Poetry Slam, Alabama Educational Theatre Association among other arts organizations throughout the years. She has also worked with after school programming such as Girls Inc. of Columbus and Phenix City, Child Youth Service (Fort Benning) and Empowered Youth of Columbus. She has worked with New Horizons Behavioral Health to develop programming for young people using techniques of West African Storytelling as a form of catharsis. Beth also collaborated with Project Change Clubhouse and used the pedagogy of Theatre of the Oppressed as a paradigm for curriculum development for young adults dealing with substance abuse issues. Recently, she completed a residency with the Boys and Girls Club of Chattahoochee Valley titled "Black Excellence: Acting with Afrofuturism". She teaches African-American Theatre Performance and Socially Responsible Theatre for her alma mater (Columbus State Department of Theatre). At the Springer Opera House, Beth has performed in countless roles including Glinda in the Wizard of Oz, Lady of the Lake in Spamalot, Rose in Fences, Miss Andrews in Mary Poppins, and Calpurnia in To Kill a Mockingbird. Beth has directed numerous productions for Dalton Little Theater, Dalton State College, Columbus State University and will direct Look Forward: The Ruby Bridges Story next season here at the Springer Opera House. Completing an artist-in-residency with South Columbus Elementary School in 2020, she used art strategies as a process for students to comprehend, empathize, and express the meaning of Ruby Bridges' tenacity to

students in kindergarten and fifth grades.

Rebecca Gossett (Production Stage Manager) recieved her Bachelor of Fine Arts in Theatre Design and Technology from Columbus State University in 2014 and has been the Springer's full-time Production Stage Manager ever since. She personally stage manages most of the Springer's mainstage series as well as oversees the stage management teams for the studio and children's theatre productions, as well as oversees the Springer's internship program with Columbus State University theatre students. 
